F. Hearing of Citizens for Items Not on the Agenda

Speakers:

Sydney Makaela Pitcher - I'm so grateful and honored to be here. I'm involved with this wonderful global environmental organization called Cleaner for Kids and they have a campaign to stop idling which is leaving your car running and not going anywhere. Did you know that leaving your car on for just one minute without going anywhere it emits more carbon emissions than smoking three packs of cigarettes. This is a big issue, especially in parking lots, when parents are dropping their kids off and picking them up. Parents and children are breathing in that toxic air leading to major health problems in children such as asthma. Asthma is the number one reason why kids have to miss school. If kids are having to miss school and absent because they have asthma; they're not able to get a quality education. Also, about 5.1 million children develop asthma every year. I also want to make you're aware that we can eliminate about 5 million tons worth of toxic carbon emissions (just by eliminating idling cars) every year. There is a solution that will also fight climate change and help to boost up kids health if we promote this no idling campaign.

What we're trying to do is get school districts to sign on to a no idling resolution where we allow metal signs to be placed in parking lots where parents and families can see and prompt them to turn off their engine when parked. Kids will be able to have the opportunity to submit no idling artwork and this is a good way to educate them at a very young age so they can help protect their own health and the health of other people when they grow up. Cleaner for Kids is paying for and supplying the signs so that the school district will not have to pay for them.

I also want to go into a little more detail about why idling is so important to me. If we eliminate idling we will also be wasting less fuel. About 200,000 barrels of fuel are lost every day and about 3.8 million gallons of fuel are wasted every day due to idling. In a time when climate change is so rapid it's important to meet our goals to reduce carbon emissions. Kids breath about 50% more air per pound than adults; kids are breathing polluted air that is going to cause them a huge problem. I hope that you'll take the opportunity to promote this wonderful project to allow these metal signs to be placed on school campuses, give the kids an opportunity to give their artwork, and educate parents so that we can all help to make this a healthier, safer, and cleaner earth for our kids.

<u>Tanya Harris</u> - It's nice to see so many familiar faces on the board. I want to speak on the Virtual Academy to make sure it's agendized for our kids knowing that they have a school to go to next year. My son attends the Virtual Academy and has been attending the Virtual Academy for the past two years since Covid. He has been doing tremendously; his grades have gone up. He has also gone up two grade levels in reading. He's autistic and he's so open with that technology and not having to be in person. He sees his peers and his teacher. He got his academic and perfect attendance awards. We're just excited about the progress he's made being in the Virtual Academy. I just want to stand here for the parents and kids that have special needs. It's just a good program and a helpful program. We know that Covid and its variants aren't going anywhere anytime soon. To ensure that our kids know

that they have a school that they can be proud of. For the books, we're also looking to have a library for the Virtual Academy.
