Multilingual Learners (MLLs): or English Learners (ELs)

- Students who are developing in the area of English proficiency and have a primary home language of a language other than English and who **have been designated as MLLs through the Initial ELPAC**

Aprendices Multilingües (MLLs): o Aprendices del Inglés (ELs)

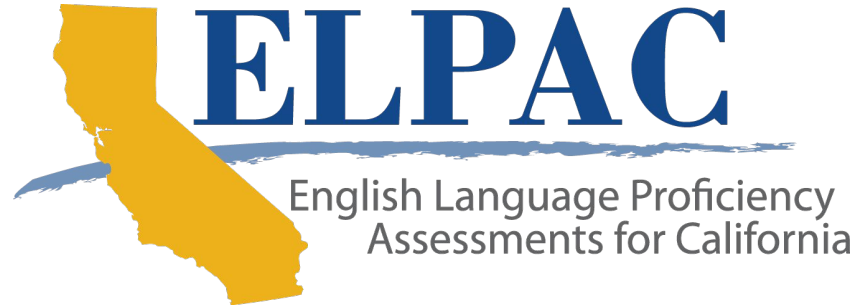
English Language Proficiency Assessments for California

- It is a test that is used to measure how well students understand English when it is not their primary language
- Information from the test helps the child's teacher provide support to the student
- The ELPAC has two parts: Initial & Summative



¿Qué es ELPAC?

- Evaluaciones de dominio del idioma inglés para California
- Es un examen que es usada para medir que tan bien un estudiante entiende el inglés cuando no es su idioma materno.
- La información del examen ayuda al maestro del niño/a a proveer apoyo para el estudiante
- El ELPAC tiene dos partes: Inicial & Sumativa

Initial ELPAC

WHO

Students take the Initial ELPAC if they have a primary language other than English and have never been previously classified as English learners.

WHAT

The Initial ELPAC is used to identify a student as either an English learner who needs support to learn English, or as fluent English proficient.

WHEN

Students are given the Initial ELPAC within 30 days of when they first enroll in a California school.

WHY

Identifying students who need help learning English is important so students can get the support they need to do well in school while receiving instruction in all school subjects.

ELPAC inicial

QUIÉN

Los estudiantes rinden el ELPAC inicial si tienen un idioma primario que no es el inglés y nunca han sido clasificados previamente como estudiantes de inglés.

QUÉ

El ELPAC inicial se utiliza para determinar si un estudiante que está aprendiendo inglés necesita apoyo o si tiene dominio del inglés.

CUÁNDO

Los estudiantes rinden el ELPAC Inicial dentro de los 30 días desde su inscripción en una escuela de California.

POR QUÉ

Identificar a los estudiantes que necesitan ayuda para aprender inglés es importante para que los estudiantes puedan obtener el apoyo que necesitan para que les vaya bien en la escuela mientras reciben instrucción en todas las materias escolares.

Summative ELPAC



Summative ELPAC

WHO

The Summative ELPAC is given to students who are identified as English learners.

WHAT

The Summative ELPAC is used to measure the skills of English learners. The results will help tell the school or district if the student is ready to be reclassified as fluent English proficient.

WHEN

Students who are English learners are given the Summative ELPAC every spring, between February and May, until they are reclassified as fluent English proficient.

HOW

The Summative ELPAC is an untimed computer-based test. Students in K through grade two will continue to take the Writing portion of the test on paper. Students in K through grade two will be tested on a one-to-one basis.

WHY

Students who are identified as English learners will take the Summative ELPAC to measure their progress in learning English.

ELPAC Sumativo

QUIÉN

Se toma el ELPAC Sumativo a los estudiantes que se determina que están aprendiendo inglés.

QUÉ

El ELPAC Sumativo se usa para medir las habilidades de los estudiantes que están aprendiendo inglés. Los resultados ayudarán a la escuela o al distrito a determinar si el estudiante está listo para una nueva clasificación como competente en inglés.

CUÁNDO

Los estudiantes que están aprendiendo inglés rinden el ELPAC sumativo cada primavera, entre febrero y mayo, hasta que son reclasificados como competentes en inglés.

CÓMO

El ELPAC Sumativo es un examen por computadora sin tiempo fijo de duración. Los estudiantes desde K hasta segundo grado continuarán haciendo la parte de escritura del examen en papel. Los estudiantes desde K a segundo grado se evaluarán en forma individual.

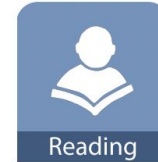
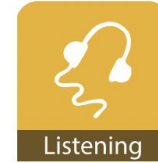
POR QUÉ

Los estudiantes que se determina que están aprendiendo inglés rendirán el ELPAC sumativo para medir su progreso en el aprendizaje del idioma.

Summative ELPAC

The purpose of the Summative ELPAC is to measure progress toward English proficiency, to help inform proper educational placements, and to help determine if a student is ready to be reclassified. This is important when ensuring that students continue to receive the supports they need to do well in school.

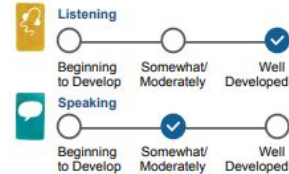

The oral language score includes Listening and Speaking.

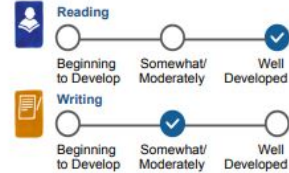

Last spring, your child took the Summative ELPAC to measure how well they are learning the English language. The test results are not used to determine whether your child moves to the next grade, but to monitor their progress and determine when they have mastered the English language.

Students who speak multiple languages have many strengths, but they may also need extra support in the classroom while learning in English. Your child's score report is broken down into different skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. You can use this information to identify where your child is doing well and where they may need more support.

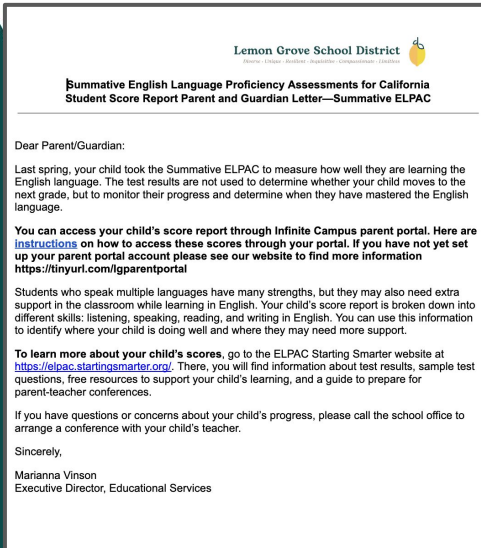

Reclassification Criteria

(Current)



- ❑ Overall Performance Level (OPL) of Well Developed Level 4 (ELPAC)
- ❑ CAASPP Performance level of Standard Exceeded or Standard Met, with consideration to Standard Nearly Met or iReady ELA/CAASPP ELA at grade level or above
- ❑ Teacher verifies that this student will be able to do grade level work in core academic subjects in a regular program designed for native and fluent English speakers. (Requires 3 teachers' signatures for approval in middle schools.)
- ❑ After approval of classroom teacher(s) and the Principal, the parent/ guardian is given an opportunity to consult with the staff regarding the reclassification process.

Criterio de Reclasificación

(Actual)



- ❑ Nivel de desempeño general (OPL) del nivel 4 bien desarrollado (ELPAC)
- ❑ Nivel de desempeño CAASPP de Estándar excedido o Estándar cumplido, con consideración a Estándar casi cumplido o iReady ELA/CAASPP ELA a nivel de grado o superior
- ❑ El maestro verifica que este estudiante podrá realizar trabajos de nivel de grado en materias académicas básicas en un programa regular diseñado para hablantes nativos y con fluidez en inglés. (Requiere la firma de 3 maestros para su aprobación en las escuelas secundarias).
- ❑ Después de la aprobación del maestro(s) del salón de clases y del director, el padre/tutor tiene la oportunidad de consultar con el personal sobre el proceso de reclasificación.

Why is reclassification significant?

- ❑ Reclassifying a student as fully English proficient changes several aspects of students' educational environment.
- ❑ Exiting MLL status eliminates MLL services though state and federal laws require LEAs to monitor students who have exited EL status for a period of four years after they have RFEP status
- ❑ An MLL designation in high school has the potential to impact access to electives or even advanced courses

The reclassification process was designed to ensure that the change in any student's ELAS designation is carefully thought through by the instructional team and families

¿Por qué es importante la reclasificación?

- ❑ Reclasificar a un alumno como totalmente competente en inglés cambia varios aspectos del entorno educativo del alumno.
- ❑ Salir de la condición de MLL elimina los servicios de MLL aunque las leyes estatales y federales requieren que las LEA supervisen a los estudiantes que han salido de la condición de EL por un período de cuatro años después de que tengan la condición de RFEP
- ❑ Una designación MLL en la escuela secundaria tiene el potencial de afectar el acceso a cursos electivos o incluso avanzados.

El proceso de reclasificación fue diseñado para asegurar que el cambio en la designación ELAS de cualquier estudiante es cuidadosamente pensado por el equipo de instrucción y las familias
